# 2020/2022 PLAN (April 1st 2020 through March 31st 2022)

**Background:** The RMIM By-Law sets five (5) objectives for the Institute as Follows:

- (1) To provide through presentations and discussions, information and opinions on matters of Military and Security importance to Canada
- (2) To maintain awareness through the use of Email and the Internet, of World Military and Political events that could influence Government and Military decisions or actions
- (3) To recognize and acknowledge those who have provided notable support to Canada's Defence and Security Forces
- (4) To promote Social and Professional contact, and
- (5) To promote the Cadet movement in Canada.

Each year, the Board of Directors is required to prepare and present for membership approval at the AGM, a Plan of Events and Budget aimed at achieving the above objectives.

There will be a Service at the Brookside Cemetery on 08 May 2020, at 18:30 hours, commemorating the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of VE Day (Victory in Europe), and Manitoba's 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and honour those who served. The Service will begin at 19:00 hours. Postponed or Canceled due to the COVID19 Pandemic.

On 09 May 2020, RMIM will join The Royal Winnipeg Rifles join in the "VE/VJ" Day Parade at the Legislature Grounds. Poppies will *NOT* be worn. Postponed or Canceled due to the COVID19 Pandemic.

### **Objective (3) – Recognition (RMIM) Awards Presentations)**

## **Objective (4) – Social and Professional Contact**

This objective has been met over the past many years with the Annual June Barbecue, the Annual Christmas Reception and Dinner in December, and allowing time for socializing at all other events of the Institute. An attempt will be made to improve on socializing times, due to logistical and COVID19 Pandemic reasons, our Summer Bar Be Que was cancelled.

During the Months of January, February and March 2019, the 17 Wing Officers Mess was closed due to upgrades to the Plumbing and Mechanical systems.

A dedication ceremony for the CT-133 Silver Star Jet monument was held 30 June 2019, at Woodhaven Park. One of the most notable changes was the bright red/orange paint job, commemorating the group of military pilots who flew the Red Knight aerobatic display aircraft from 1958 to 1969. This project was initiated by the RMIM six years ago, with the assistance of City Councilor Grant Nordman and was completed during the Month of January 2019.

BGen Rod Slaughter was a fearless RCAF jet pilot, who took on the coveted role of Red Knight, solo performance pilot, and then lead soloist for the Golden Centennaires Aerobatic Flying Team. His Son and two Daughters spoke eloquently about their Father and his favourite plane. Two Councillors from the City of Winnipeg, along with many others were in attendance.

On the first of January each year, the RMIM continues to support the New Years Day Levee, with the organization and transportation to various Military Locations and Government House.

### Objective (5) - Promote the Cadet Movement in Canada

The Board will continue to search for opportunities for further assistance to the Cadet movement.
