ACTION PLAN JANUARY 2024 TO MARCH 2025

Background: The RMIM By-Law sets five (5) objectives for the Institute as Follows:

Objective (4) – Social and Professional Contact

We have had several Presentations so far this year, and we will be having a Summer Luncheon in June 2024, the Christmas Luncheon will also be held in December of this year.

On the first of January each year, the RMIM continues to support the New Years Day Levee, with the organization and transportation to various Military Locations. The Levee at Government House was not held in 2024.

Objective (5) – Promote the Cadet Movement in Canada

The Board will continue to search for opportunities for further assistance to the Cadet movement.

The Hubbell Awards are named after Major Ted Hubbell, a World War Two Veteran, who devoted much of his life encouraging the development of youth. He was President of the United Services Institute of Manitoba (now the Royal Military Institute of Manitoba) when he died in 1967.

His colleagues in the United services Institute of Manitoba made the decision to honour the work he had been doing by initially presenting three \$100.00 scholarships annually in his memory. The value of the scholarships remained unchanged for more than thirty five years.

The Hubbell awards were incorporated as a registered charity in 2004. After incorporation, with vision and foresight by many of our past and present members, today Hubbell can present 12 scholarships of \$1,250.00.

The Hubbell Awards Evening this year was limited to invited guests, but we hope to open it up to others in September 2024.

The Recipient in 2023 of the RMIM sponsored Hubbell Scholarship was Cadet WO2 Retinder Singh Mayr, of the 191 West Winnipeg Rotary Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron, who received a Scholarship of \$1,250.00.

For 2024/2025, it remains the intention of the Board to:

- a. Promote a positive image of Cadet programs at our Presentations, in the Media, and in conversation with Friends and Acquaintances with Cadet age Children or Grand Children,
- b. Encourage RMIM Members individually to include the Provincial Cadet Leagues or a specific Cadet Corps in their personal annual charity giving.
- c. Suggest to non-RMIM Business and Social Associates that the Land, Sea and Air Cadets Movements are worthy of their support (and financial contributions are only one way).
- d. Encourage RMIM Members and Non-Members to become working members of the various Manitoba Branches of the Cadet League of Canada.
